

ThriveWorx Internship Changing the Way the World Fights Poverty

Internship Overview

The ThriveWorx Internship program creates opportunities for university students and recent graduates to partner with us in helping farming communities to thrive. Interning with us means more than getting an inside view of an international non-profit. As an intern, you'll work on real projects and challenges that impact the lives of our farming communities across the world. You'll see firsthand the collective impact of business and philanthropy working together to create sustainable solutions to poverty.

During the internship you'll gain experience in a friendly and professional work environment while tackling projects that provide real solutions to organizational needs and demands. While learning the skills needed to launch toward your next career step, the internship will equip you with unique enrichment experiences such as networking, career coaching, access to barista training, and exposure to our cutting-edge holistic development model.

Goals:

- 1. Expose intern to a variety of functions within an international development non-governmental organization (NGO). Intern has the opportunity to support specific real-world projects, collaborate within a team, and gain exposure to research, communications, event planning, and project management methodology useful in any career they pursue.
- 2. **Provide immersive experience in a friendly and professional work environment.** Intern works alongside an accomplished team of staff (and other interns) and participates in team building and other educational opportunities that should prove valuable to the intern's professional future.
- 3. **Intern leaves with professional work and office experience**. The intern leaves with tangible accomplishments to add to their portfolio, and new relationships with a network of people and organizations that can help to direct their next career or educational step.

Focus Areas & Output: Each internship will be tailored to the areas of study and interests of the intern alongside the current needs of the organization, with a priority given to helping ThriveWorx move the needle on projects that support work to alleviate poverty and support our communities. Output could include internal contributions that improve ThriveWorx's systems, efficiency, and/or impact. It could come in the form of research assistance, or in collaboration with partner organizations and networks.

Eligibility: Interns must have completed or be enrolled in their senior year of undergraduate studies, or be a recent graduate.

Compensation: The program is voluntary and not eligible for compensation from ThriveWorx.

Time Commitment: Summer Interns should commit 32 hours of work per week for ten weeks. Semester Interns should commit 16 hours of work per week for five months.

Location: This is typically a hybrid internship. Intern will be expected to keep office hours on a designated inoffice day, which could fluctuate based on the organization's calendar and needs. The remainder of work hours will be held remotely.
